The Parish Council were pleased to hear that following a recent meeting of the City of York Council Planning Committee, Planning permission for Bishopthorpe Whiterose JFC to develop the land on Sim balk Lane, known as the Ashfield estate, into an area containing several football pitches and a clubhouse, was unanimously voted in by all Council members present at the meeting.

5.4.3 *Moor Lane, York - Public Consultation – Email from Barwood Land –* Barwood Land are in the process of developing proposals to build five hundred new houses, a primary school, new sports pitches, allotments and a children's play area on land at Moor Lane, Woodthorpe. This area falls outside the parish of Bishopthorpe. The Company has a consultation website at: http://www.moorlandeconsultation.co.uk/ for access by members of the public.

> It is understood that this area was earmarked on the (not yet agreed) Local Plan by the City Council for development. A number of Councillors expressed concerns that the development would have a negative impact on local wildlife however, the Chairman reminded the meeting that there is a pressing need for affordable housing in York and this site is regarded as suitable under the Local Plan.

It was agreed that the Parish Council will keep a close watch on developments.

campsite in the ings fields, the twenty-five-pitch limit has been exceeded. It is understood that a City Council Inspector has made a site visit and issued a firststage warning to the owner.

Cllr. Jemison then raised the issue the blue concrete-filled barrel at the entrance to the ings field. This barrel was strategically placed by the Parish Council many years ago to prevent the footpath being regularly used by vehicles belonging to the mooring occupants. The Parish Council are now extremely concerned that the barrel has been moved and frequent vehicle usage is occurring in this area. A letter will be sent to Mr Mandy of York Marine Services to request the barrel's re-instatement to its original position. Action Clerk.

- 6.5 Youth Support and Children's Recreation
 - 6.5.1 *Monthly park inspection update* Cllr. Harrison reported high levels of litter in the park during the last week. A non-toxic (to humans / animals) weed killer has been applied to overgrown vegetation.

Councillors were asked to keep a close watch on closing time of the park as large groups of youths are beginning to congregate there in the evenings. The official closing time is 7.30 pm or dusk in the winter months.

The inspection kit was passed to Cllr. Jemison for the month going forward.

6.5.2 Wooden post – A quote from Play Dale for £375.80 has been received to replace two metres of wooden posts surrounding the sand pit. However, a second quote from a local supplier to replace five metres is for £350.00. Cllr. Jemison proposed accepting the local supplier quote. This was seconded by Cllr. Mellors and agreed unanimously. It was also noted that as this local supplier always provides better quotes than the Cumbrian based Play Dale and, on that basis, it was agreed that they will be used in future.
